
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




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Robotics Meeting

ParentPulse Surveys What do you think?

We want you to know that you are heard. Not only that, we have invested in a process that intentionally and proactively solicits your feedback. We have partnered with an organization called *ParentPulse* to capture valuable information about what you are thinking and how you feel. We are a school community, and we believe everyone's opinion matters. We also believe that everyone has something to offer, and good ideas often come from parents.

This process involves sending out surveys over the course of 90 days. After 90 days, every parent will have received an opportunity to complete a short, 5-minute survey. This survey includes the opportunity to leave written comments that we see and can respond to in real time. You have the option of identifying yourself or completing the survey anonymously.

While we would like for EVERYONE to complete the survey, research indicates that only 22% of you will take this short 5-minute survey. Put another way, only about 1 in 4 or 1 in 5 parents will complete the survey. This means that when we decide to combine your ideas with our own for action steps, roughly 75% - 80% of parental input is missing. Simply put, if you want to be heard, please complete the survey. Of course, I always encourage you to reach out to teachers, principals, and to me directly.

To recap, if you have not already received your survey, please look for it to arrive between now and Christmas. Our administrative team will review fall semester results, and a similar survey will start again in early January to conclude by April.
